- Region→ Regions have been drawn up according to a comment in the Bylaws and there are 20 of them, with 20 and ensuing decimals reserved for international members. Represents majority and minority opinions of those they serve. A representative is allowed a seat on the Board of Trustees.

- Groups (G.S.R.)→ elect a GSR to represent them at the district level. Each G.S.R communicates his or her group's "conscience" on important matters of policy considered by the district and Area Assembly.
- Intergroup \rightarrow main purpose is to help alcoholics find AA meetings and assist newcomers in the recovery program of Alcoholics Anonymous.
- **District Committee (D.C.M.s and D.C.M.C.s)** → the D.C.M. is the primary contact through the G.S.R or group contact. Group representatives attend district meetings where they are kept upto-date on A.A activities and topics of interest. Are elected by the district GSRs to represent their district at the General Service Conference.
- . General Service Conference →

- **Group** → Elects a Group Rep and an Intergroup Rep
- Intergroup → is a service arm that serves Al-Anon groups in a specific geographic area and is directly responsible to the groups it serves. IRs represent the meeting's interest four times a year at Intergroup Representative meetings.
- **District** At these meetings GRs discuss service activities, group issues and are a forum for groups and information from the area and the WSO, with GRs having voting privileges. A district may host regular events, such as workshops and speaker meetings, for the local fellowship.
- Area An area comprises several districts. Each area has regular meetings (known as assemblies) where GRs meet and vote on issues impacting that area, host workshops and speakers and bring area information back to their groups. At area assemblies, GRs elect a delegate to the annual World Service Conference.
- World Service Conference the WSC meets annually to interface with the World Service Office, which is managed by administrators and overseen by the Board of Trustees (who meet more regularly themselves).

CMA

- **Groups** \rightarrow encouraged to register with CMA World Services and elect service representatives to the Area assembly. The GSR participates in the decision-making at the District and Area.
- Intergroups \rightarrow exist outside the service structure of CMA and function solely to provide services to local groups. Groups in and around cities joined together to provide services common to all the local groups. Intergroups exist to serve the groups who formed them.
- **District** Districts exist primarily to connect local groups to the CMA general service structure.

 Districts elect trusted servants, primarily a District Committee Member (DCM), who chairs the District meetings and also serves on the
